Hear My People Cry

A conference that explores the dilemmas and opportunities of living a Christian life in the modern world—exploring what it means to “live justly, love tenderly, and walk humbly with God.” It will focus on the implications of “doing justice” in the places where we live.

MAIN SPEAKERS

John Battle MP was national coordinator of Church Action on Poverty from 1983 until he was elected as the MP for West Leeds in 1987. His parliamentary interests have included a wide range of social justice issues.

Dr Patrick Riordan SJ is assistant director of Heythrop. He currently teaches Political Philosophy, Religion and Ethics on the undergraduate courses and on the postgraduate MA in Christian Ethics. He is the author of numerous books and articles.

Sr Margaret Scott acf is an experienced teacher and lecturer. She is experienced at spiritual direction and renewal of organisations. Her most recent book, *Yesterday's Bread*, makes the argument that the Eucharist is deeply political and potentially subversive.

Ivanete de Araújo works for the support agency Apoio. She is head of advocacy work and leader of the homeless movement pushing the Sao Paulo city government to provide more housing for the poor. Apoio is a CAFOD partner.

Fr Tom Cullinan is a priest of the Liverpool archdiocese. He is a well-respected speaker and writer on spiritual matters. He will provide reflections and lead prayer throughout the Conference.

CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE

Children and young people are a vital part of the NJPN conference. Separate programmes are run for the different age groups with a crèche for children under 5's and a specially designed YKIDS Programme for 5 to 11 year olds. 12 to 18 year olds will be involved in planning their own programme, which will explore the theme of the conference and provide them with an active and thought provoking weekend.

NJPN is committed to the protection of children, young people and vulnerable people. People of all ages and ethnic origins are welcome & encouraged to attend conference.

ACCOMMODATION

The Hayes Centre is a Christian residential conference centre in the Derbyshire countryside a few miles from the M1.

There is access and some en-suite rooms for the less physically able.

Standard accommodation is available for families and those who are prepared to share a room. The majority of the family rooms are en-suite and available at standard rate.

While the cost for adults has increased slightly this year, in line with Hayes charges, we have absorbed some of the increased costs for young people to help families to attend. *(There are some bursaries available for young people.)*

Child and Low Income rates are subsidised. **We count on the generous donations of those who can afford a little extra to make these possible.**

BOOKING TERMS AND CONDITIONS - Please read carefully

1. Bookings are processed in the order they are received.
2. A booking is only accepted on receipt of the appropriate deposit.
3. Every effort is made to provide the type of room requested but, owing to limited accommodation, families with older children may be placed in adjacent rooms.
4. Low Income rate is heavily subsidised and is intended for those who would otherwise be unable to attend.
5. Low Income and part-time participants will be allocated standard shared accommodation unless an en-suite room is requested and a supplement paid.
6. Conference participants are requested to pay the balance due on their booking by Wednesday 11 June 2008.
7. Cancellations after 11 June 2008 will be liable for the basic accommodation costs unless the place can be filled.
8. Non-attenders who have failed to pay in full will also be liable for the basic accommodation costs.
9. **To encourage early booking, there will be a surcharge of £5 per booking for those received after the closing date of 16 May 2008.**
