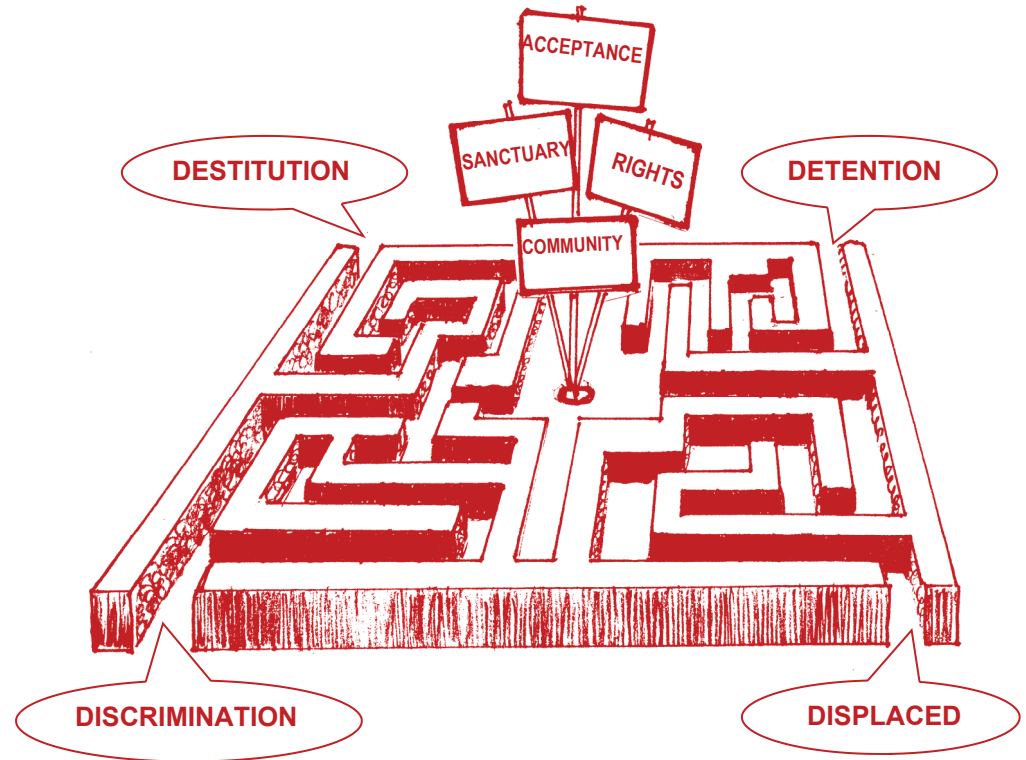

Come to a place where we can share our struggles, hopes and fears about this fraught and complex subject. Bringing together our experiences and ideas we can overcome the dead ends and diversions of the migration maze, and emerge hopeful and ready to travel on in harmony.

OPEN SPACE

People attending will be invited to generate the agenda by leading or taking part in small break out sessions around the question: ***Migration, Asylum, People on the Move: How can we respond to the challenge of the Gospel?*** The process will be facilitated by Open Space expert **Annette Zera**.

SPEAKERS

Our speakers' input will provide insights to stimulate our discussions:

Don Flynn has worked in the field of migration policy since the mid-1970s and currently leads the Migrants' Rights Network, He is also involved in networking with migrants' rights organisations across Europe.

Professor Mary C Grey is a theologian whose research and teaching have encompassed many contemporary issues, examining the relationship between social justice and theology from a feminist perspective. She is constantly attempting to redefine how we might be 'church' in politically challenging situations.

Neil Jameson is founding Executive Director of the Citizen Organising Foundation and Lead Organiser of London Citizens, whose campaigns are demanding respect and dignity for vulnerable migrants through the 'Strangers into Citizens' call for an earned amnesty for long-term migrants.

Patrick Lynch SSCC is bishop for the South East area of the diocese of Southwark and has worked in parishes with many migrant communities. As Chair for the Office for Refugee Policy at Catholic Bishops Conference in 2008 he published Mission of the Church to Migrants in England and Wales, setting out a pastoral strategy for Christians in contemporary Britain.

JUST FAIR

Agencies will be displaying goods and resources, and information and ideas about practical action can be obtained at the "Just Fair" marketplace.

CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE

Children and young people are a vital part of the NJPN conference. There will be a crèche for children under 5 and a specially designed YKIDS Programme for 5 to 11 year olds. 12 to 18 year olds will be involved in planning their own programme, which will explore the theme of the conference and provide them with an active and thought provoking weekend.

NJPN is committed to the protection of children, young people and vulnerable people. People of all ages and ethnic origins are welcome & encouraged to attend conference.

ACCOMMODATION

The Hayes Centre is a Christian residential conference centre in the Derbyshire countryside a few miles from the M1.

There is access and some en-suite rooms for the less physically able.

Standard accommodation is available for families and those who are prepared to share a room. The majority of the family rooms are en-suite and available at standard rate.

While the cost for adults has increased slightly this year, in line with Hayes charges, we have absorbed some of the increased costs for young people to help families to attend. *(There are some bursaries available for young people.)*

Child and Low Income rates are subsidised. **We count on the generous donations of those who can afford a little extra to make these possible.**

BOOKING TERMS AND CONDITIONS - Please read carefully

1. Bookings are processed in the order they are received.
2. A booking is only accepted on receipt of the appropriate deposit.
3. Every effort is made to provide the type of room requested but, owing to limited accommodation, families with older children may be placed in adjacent rooms.
4. Low Income rate is heavily subsidised and is intended for those who would otherwise be unable to attend.
5. Low Income and part-time participants will be allocated standard shared accommodation unless an en-suite room is requested and a supplement paid.
6. Conference participants are requested to pay the balance due on their booking by Wednesday 10 June 2009.
7. Cancellations after 10 June 2009 will be liable for the basic accommodation costs unless the place can be filled.
8. Non-attenders who have failed to pay in full will also be liable for the basic accommodation costs.
9. **Adult bookings received after 15 May 2009 will be subject to a surcharge of £5 (does not apply to Saturday only).**
