As China emerges as a major player on the world stage, our need for a deeper understanding of its reality also grows.

This conference will seek to: raise awareness about the economic, environmental and military role of China in the world; understand about the Church in China; and learn about the culture of the Chinese people.

SPEAKERS

Xinran was a radio journalist in China before moving to London where she wrote *The Good Women of China* (2002). Her new book, *Message From an Unknown Chinese Mother* (2010), is a collection of stories from Chinese mothers who have lost or had to abandon children. Xinran often advises the media about western relations with China, and makes frequent television and radio appearances.

John Baptist Zhang is a diocesan priest from Hebei Province, China. He and his team have been dedicated to the works of media evangelization, social services and academic studies, so as to promote dialogue, reconciliation and co-operation within the Church in China, and between the Church and society in China.

Martin Palmer is Secretary General of the Alliance of Religions and Conservation. He has worked in the field of religions and the environment for more than 30 years and is a regular radio and television commentator, invited to speak on religious, ethical and historical issues.

Li Bingqin is a lecturer in Social Policy at the London School of Economics, a research associate of The Centre for Analyses of Social Exclusion and member of the Cities Program, both at LSE. Her current research projects include migrant housing in Chinese cities, intergenerational support in Chinese cities, and social inclusion of rural to urban migrants

The conference will be chaired by **Fr Eamonn O'Brien**, Director of Cultural Exchange with China. **Cardinal Keith O'Brien** will celebrate the Mass.

JUST FAIR

Agencies will be displaying goods and resources, and information and ideas about practical action can be obtained at the "Just Fair" marketplace.

CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE

Children and young people are a vital part of the NJPN conference. There will be a crèche for children under 5 and a Y-KIDS Programme for 5 to 11 year olds. 12 to 16/18 year olds will explore the conference theme in an active and thought provoking weekend led by InReality Youth Team from Hallam Diocese.

NJPN is committed to the protection of children, young people and vulnerable people. People of all ages and ethnic origins are welcome & encouraged to attend conference.

ACCOMMODATION

The Hayes Centre is a Christian residential conference centre in the Derbyshire countryside a few miles from the M1. (see www.cct.org.uk)

There is access and some en-suite rooms for the less physically able.

Standard accommodation is available for families (minimum of 3 sharing) and those who are prepared to share a room. The majority of the family rooms are en-suite and available at standard rate.

While the cost for adults has increased slightly this year, in line with Hayes charges, we have absorbed some of the increased costs for young people to help families to attend. (There are some bursaries available for young people.)

Child and Low Income rates are subsidised. **We count on the generous donations of those who can afford a little extra to make these possible.**

BOOKING TERMS AND CONDITIONS - Please read carefully

1. Bookings are processed in the order they are received.
2. A booking is only accepted on receipt of the appropriate deposit.
3. Every effort is made to provide the type of room requested but, owing to limited accommodation, families with older children may be placed in adjacent rooms.
4. Low Income rate is heavily subsidised and is intended for those who would otherwise be unable to attend.
5. Low Income and part-time participants will be allocated standard shared accommodation unless an en-suite room is requested and a supplement of £12.50 per night paid.
6. Conference participants are requested to pay the balance due on their booking by Wednesday 20 June 2012
7. Cancellations after 20 June 2012 will be liable for the basic accommodation costs unless the place can be filled.
8. Non-attenders who have failed to pay in full will also be liable for the basic accommodation costs.
9. **Adult bookings received after 18 May 2012 will be subject to a surcharge of £5** (does not apply to Saturday only).

A coach service is provided from/to Derby Station on Friday evening (5.15pm) and Sunday afternoon (2.00pm) for £5 each way.

MEALS AT CONFERENCE

We have agreed with The Hayes that meals will be provided as far as possible within our budget according to LOAF principles (Locally sourced, Organically produced, Animal friendly, Fairly traded). **A meat option will be therefore only be given at the Saturday evening meal and will need to be pre-booked;** this will probably be lamb as this is the most likely to be locally reared and free range. All other meals will be vegetarian (including dairy and eggs).
