Justice At Work: A place of safety, fulfillment and growth?

SPEAKERS

David McLoughlin is Senior Lecturer in Theology at Newman University College and honorary Lecturer at the University of Birmingham. His interests include the inter-relationship between theology and social and political life and specifically the world of work. He is a founder member of the Movement of Christian Workers.

Jon Cruddas MP was a member of the Transport and General Workers Union from 1989 until his election in 2001 when he became MP for Dagenham. As deputy political secretary to Tony Blair he worked heavily on the introduction of the minimum wage.

Frances O'Grady became TUC Deputy General Secretary in January 2003, the first woman ever to hold this post. She has lead responsibility for a wide range of key areas of policy development across the TUC's work. In April 2007 she was appointed to the Low Pay Commission.

John Battle is a former National Co-ordinator of Church Action on Poverty and was MP for Leeds West from 1987 until he stood down in 2010. He was a minister at the Foreign and Commonwealth Office and the Prime Minister's envoy to all faith communities. He is now active in his local community.

Sheila Kamboe is the Deputy Director of the Jesuit Center for Theological Reflection (JCTR), Lusaka, Zambia, a key CAFOD advocacy partner working on many areas of economic justice. She has worked in UN programmes in Sierra Leone, East Timor and Cambodia.
