Destitution in the UK 2023

The Joseph Rowntree Foundation writes: =

This study, the fourth in the Destitution in the UK series, reveals approximately 3.8 million people experienced destitution in 2022, including around one million children. This is almost two and a half times the number in 2017, and nearly triple the number of children. There is an urgent need for action to tackle destitution in the UK.

There has been a shameful increase in the level of destitution in the UK, with a growing number of people struggling to afford to meet their most basic physical needs to stay warm, dry, clean and fed. This has deep and profound impacts on health, mental health and people's prospects; it also puts a strain on already overstretched services.

Nearly three-quarters of people experiencing destitution are in receipt of social security payments, further evidence of benefit inadequacy. Ad-hoc support from the Government, first during the pandemic, and now to help with the cost of living, has not helped the rising level of destitution. We urgently need a bold and ambitious programme of action to address destitution and its corrosive impacts.

Breaking: Statement from Gaza Ministry of Education

This was shared on X (formerly known as Twitter) this morning by Sulaiman Ahmed (an investigative journalist): - <u>"This year's class period has officially ended due to the deaths of most of the students."</u>

I have been trying to find out if this tragic post is real, or just one that is doing the rounds. I haven't yet found an actual statement online or through a news agency from the Gaza Ministry of Education, but real or not, it is a very sobering statement.

Action - Seek a ceasefire and to end Israeli occupation of the West Bank and Gaza Strip

The Balfour Project write: - We want the Government to seek a ceasefire and also seek to address the root cause of the current conflict by promoting dialogue and advocating for the end of Israeli occupation of the West Bank and Gaza Strip. This war has the potential to spill over into neighbouring lands and that would only worsen the humanitarian situation. Palestinians have suffered from occupation and blockades for many years now. I urge the Government to pursue a just and peaceful resolution to the current conflict. With peace comes stability for all of us.

Gaza: Christian leaders demand immediate ceasefire to deliver aid safely

In a similar way to above, Christian Aid, along with 20 church leaders and Christian organisations, are demanding a ceasefire on humanitarian grounds.

Patriarch Pizzaballa sends letter to faithful of Jerusalem

Vatican News writes: - In his <u>pastoral letter released on Tuesday</u>, Patriarch Pierbattista Pizzaballa spoke to the Catholic faithful of his diocese about the "difficult and painful" period they are enduring.

He said people are inundated with "images of horrors" that have "made pain, frustration, and anger explode within us."

After war broke out on 7 October following a Hamas militant incursion into Israel, Pope Francis called for a Day of Prayer, Fasting, and Penance on Tuesday, 17 October.

Patriarch Pizzaballa expressed his gratitude for the Pope's initiative and the prayers of people around the world, and invited everyone to renew their prayers for peace on Friday, 27 October, for a second iteration of the Day of Prayer for Peace.

"It is perhaps the main thing we Christians can do at this time: pray, do penance, intercede. For this, we thank the Holy Father from the bottom of our hearts," he said.

You may remember that a couple of weeks ago, Cardinal Pizzaballa offered himself in exchange for Israeli children taken by Hamas and held in

Pax Christi International writes: - In the wake of the ongoing violence that erupted on October 7th, 2023, in the Holy Land, Pax Christi International has issued a second statement urging for an immediate ceasefire and to guarantee humanitarian support to the affected civilians.

CAFOD Statement on airstrike on St Porphyrios Church hall in Gaza

CAFOD released the following statement on the 20th October: - We are shocked to hear from our partner at Caritas Jerusalem that a staff member along with her child and husband were killed when the hall adjacent to the St Porphyrios Church in Gaza was struck last night. Her sister and two children were also among the casualties. The hall provided refuge for 411 people and five Caritas staff members were present.

We extend our heartfelt condolences to the grieving families and all those injured and affected.

Shock, rage, increasing unease: UK's Jewish community wrestles with response to war

Some weeks ago, before this conflict began, I attended an interfaith event where a Jewish man said that just because they were Jews didn't mean that they supported what was going on in Israel.

This article from The Guardian shows a divided community. Many were in support of Israel when Hamas attacked, but now, with innocent people, and especially children, being killed in Gaza, there seems to be a lot of confusion.

The Guardian quote Na'amod, an organisation of left-wing Jews, *that* campaigns against the Israeli occupation of Palestinian territory and the "crimes of apartheid". "We will not let our grief be weaponised to justify

genocide," Na'amod wrote on X. You can read the full article here.

Stop Praying for Gaza

Rev. Dr. Mitri Raheb (Founder and President of Dar al-Kalima University College of Arts and Culture in Bethlehem in the occupied West Bank) writes this interesting piece, published by Medium.

Not only is he in touch with people in Gaza and can report on the eyewitness accounts they have given him, but he relays the fact that they need more than our prayers.

It makes for very sad and thought-provoking reading.

Action - Resources for your parish or group

What can be done, apart from pray and think about the people in this troubled area? If you want to highlight the war in your parish or community, check out the Pax Christi UK website, who have a number of <u>Prayer</u> <u>Cards</u> that can be used in situations of war.

Also, to support the Palestinian Christians, why not think about buying some <u>Palestinian goods</u>.

Actions for Peace in the Holy Land

Take action today by looking at ten ideas that <u>Eye Witness Blogs</u> have on their website. They say 'Act now for justice, equality and an end to the *military occupation of Palestine*'.

Eye Witness Blogs are from EAPPI UK & Ireland (The World Council of Churches (WCC) Ecumenical Accompaniment Programme in Palestine and Israel). They share the eyewitness stories of Palestinians and Israelis and advocate for justice, equality and an end to the military occupation of Palestine.

Fuel, water and food deprivation used as collective punishment

I will finish with these sobering words from the United Nations, reported on by The Balfour Project.

Philippe Lazzarini, Head of the UNRWA (United Nations Relief and Works Agency), gave a Press Conference at the UNRWA Headquarters in East Jerusalem on Friday.

He starts off: - As we speak, people in Gaza are dying. They are dying

only from bombs and strikes. Soon, many more will die from the consequences of siege imposed on the Gaza Strip. Basic services are crumbling.

Medicine is running out. Food and water are running out. The streets of Gaza have started overflowing with sewage.

He goes on to point out that: we should avoid conveying the message that a few trucks a day means the siege is lifted for humanitarian aid. It is not. The current system in place is geared to fail.

What is needed is meaningful and uninterrupted aid flow. To succeed, we need a humanitarian ceasefire to ensure this aid reaches those in need. This is not too much to ask for.

Philippe talks about the colleagues that they have lost already in Gaza and the fact that civil order is collapsing.

His final words are: - Finally, as Commissioner-General, I intend to visit Gaza, to express solidarity and amplify the voice of the communities and our staff. Gaza is where I was when I started my career as a humanitarian more than 30 years ago. This is where I need to be today.

Ask your MP to sign the Stop Burning Trees Pledge

Biofuelwatch write: - Did you know that the UK Government is using our energy bills to fund tree burning in UK power stations like Drax in Yorkshire and Lynemouth in Northumberland? This wood burning is devastating forests, wildlife and communities around the world, whilst also making the climate crisis worse.

<u>Please write to your MP asking them to sign the Stop Burning Trees pledge</u> <u>- to call for an end to subsidies for tree burning in UK power stations.</u>

Let's talk about Allotments...

Greenpeace write the following: - There are almost 175,000 applications on the UK's allotment waiting list - with some people waiting 15 years. But did you know that we have the legal right to them?

That's why two weeks ago artists and volunteers, led by Dr. JC Niala, took a living artwork to the government to give those people a voice. Then using the same artwork, they reclaimed land from Tesco and the industrial food system to demonstrate how land can be transformed for community food growing.



They have shared this photograph showing the artwork, and there is a video called <u>The Waiting List</u>, which tells of their project, the rights people have to an allotment. and the work that they have done to reclaim land from Tesco.

Greenpeace say: - The artwork taken to the government and then used to reclaim land from Tesco is a living artwork. It's made from seed paper and embedded with ash from the Amazon, as a reminder of the destruction the industrial food system is causing. It is also embedded with brown mustard, white clover, sunflowers, red fescue, and rye grass seeds, and specifically chosen to help heal the soil and make it suitable to grow food.

They write: - The existential challenge of climate change is having a growing impact on the vocations and beliefs of those in Christian ministry, reports Green Christian. The environmental charity has been providing support since 2021 to clergy and others grappling with the emotional, pastoral, spiritual and moral impacts of the climate crisis on individuals and communities. Many clergy feel unprepared for ministry and leadership in a context of increasing environmental anxiety and destabilisation. The charity is responding through its "Cloud and Fire" programme, of which a third intake begins in January 2024.

4. Refugees/Migrants

Refugees at Home Newsletter

At the start of the war in Ukraine, I had ideas that I would host someone. Well, it was a good job that I didn't as my eldest son decided to change jobs, and moved home from Portsmouth, so I now have a full complement of 'children' in my house (and other animals!).

I do still receive the Refugees at Home newsletter, and this month I saw this plea: The Home Office is still making a huge number of asylum decisions - as many as 5,000 a week - in order to meet its target of clearing the asylum-seeker backlog by the end of the year.

So far, we have only heard of positive decisions, granting people refugee status, but we know that cannot last.

While this is welcome, the eviction of successful refugees onto the street with just 7 days notice definitely is not. Imagine going from living on £9 a week in a Home Office hotel, banned from working or studying and unable to open a bank account, to trying to build your new life in just one week.

It's an impossible expectation, and the result is a huge increase in homelessness amongst refugees. Numbers are so high that lots of our colleague organisations have had to make the difficult decision to close to new referrals. We haven't. But, for example, last Thursday, 61 potential guests applied to us for hosting. 61. In one day.

So, if you were thinking about hosting – even for only three or four weeks – now is the time.

5. Fix the Food System News

CAFOD write: - After thousands of CAFOD supporters wrote to both the UK government and the World Bank to show we are standing up for the rights of small farmers to freely use, save and share their seeds, they have started to listen.

Over 70,000 parishioners from 762 parishes have signed in solidarity a letter written by Salina, a small farmer from Bangladesh calling on the World Bank to protect farmers' seed rights.

We have just got back from the World Bank's annual meeting in Morocco where we delivered the letters directly into the hands of the Director on Global Food Practice. And our campaign is working! Following our latest actions, the World Bank agreed to meet with CAFOD representatives in both London and Morocco and have started to look at the issue.

This is an important step forward in this campaign. But we know that big businesses will continue lobbying the World Bank to try to put profits before access to food.

Next year we will continue to strengthen international solidarity and build on what we've achieved this year.

6. Updated Real Living Wage

Church Action on Poverty report that the Real Living Wage has been updated. It is now £12 per hour, or £13.15 per hour in London.

I have contacted our Diocese and forwarded the link onto them, plus I will be addressing it with our parish.

(stop press...my contact in the Diocese has already confirmed that they are absolutely on top of this - so no one needs to contact the Diocese of Brentwood - but feel free to check with your individual parishes in that area, in case of contract cleaners etc.)

Please contact your Diocese and/or Parish to check that they are aware of this, and make sure that they don't get confused with the Governmental National Living Wage, which is a lot less.

7. Pact research reveals devastating impact of prison on families and children

Pact, the Prison Advice and Care Trust, have brought out a new report, 'Serving a Hidden Sentence' which documents how families, already on low incomes, are struggling, due to the loss of their partner's income whilst in prison, and the costs of staying in touch.

8. Coming for warmth and staying for the welcome

This article by David Barclay, through Grace + Truth, struck a chord with me. In the next couple of weeks our parish hopes to open up a 'Warm Welcome Space' for a few hours per week on a Friday, offering up a simple lunch of soup and a roll, hot drinks, and some biscuits and possibly cakes.

It is not just those who need the warm space that we want to attract - but those people, some of our parishioners included, who need the company. As it says in the article, this is not just a sticking plaster solution to a deep structural problem; we hope it will be a source of connection and of belonging for those who need it.
