## The Last Word

### \*\*\*ACTION OF THE WEEK\*\*\*

#### #StopRoseBank

The campaigns to stop the Rosebank Oil Field from going ahead have been simmering on for what seems like years. The most recent one I have picked up is from the Palestine Solidarity Campaign, and they cite that this is not only a project that would be catastrophic for the climate, but would send more than £200 million to Delek Group, one of Israel's biggest oil companies. Ithaca Energy, one of the operators of the Rosebank oil field, is majority owned by the Delek Group .

Palestine Solidarity Campaign write:

**We're joining the Stop Rosebank campaign to call on the British government to reject the Rosebank oil field, a project that would be catastrophic for the climate, and would send more than £200 million to Delek Group, one of Israel's biggest oil companies.**

**Delek profits from illegal settlements in the West Bank and its subsidiary Delek Israel supplies fuel to the Israeli military, with military personnel able to refuel at hundreds of its petrol stations. Delek Group has been included by the UN in a list of businesses that are complicit in human rights concerns in Palestine.**

**Delek Group is contributing to Israel's ongoing apartheid and genocide.**

Most recently, at the end of November, it was announced on the [#StopRoseBank](#) website that *the UK is now the first major oil and gas producer in the Global North to shift away from fossil fuels - the kind of leadership needed to drive a global phase-out.*

*The government has just announced that they are ending new oil and gas exploration in the UK and have started a plan for workers and communities to transition away from fossil fuels.*

However, this new commitment **does not** include fields that have already been granted a license, such as Rosebank and Cambo. (For those of you who don't know, Rosebank is an oil and gas field around 80 miles north-west of Shetland.)

You only need to read the articles on the subject from news outlets, as well as climate activists, to know that Rosebank means bad news as far as the planet is concerned.

Esme Stallard, Climate and Science Reporter from [BBC News](#), reported on the full scale of damage to the climate back in October.

### 1. Climate and Environment

#### **Earth blocks keep homes cool while cutting emissions in Kenya's drylands**

It is always good to share something positive when it comes to doing something for the climate...

This story from Climate Home News tells how local technology is keeping homes cooler in up to 30 degree temperatures in Kenya. *"The project uses compressed earth block (CEB) technology, drawing on traditional building methods and local materials – including soil, timber, grass and cow dung – to keep buildings cool in the highland climate. The thick earth walls provide insulation against the heat."*

The article then goes onto mention that at COP30 in Belem it was the first call to action on sustainable, affordable housing. *"The buildings and construction sector accounts for 37% of global emissions, making it the world's largest emitter of greenhouse gases, according to the UN Environment Programme (UNEP)."*

#### **Spot-On Treatment for Pets**

Back in the summer, one of our active members, Angela Rigby from Cardiff, wrote to me asking whether we knew anything about the detrimental affect that flea/tick/parasite spot-on treatment had on wildlife. We didn't have any information ourselves on it, so Angela followed it up with the RSPB.

Angela's email to them particularly mentioned '*that if a dog that has been recently treated swims in a river it can clear that section of insect life with damaging effect on fish, birds and mammals that use the river. And that when both cats and dogs are treated and shed hair this can have a damaging effect on insects and the birds that feed on them. Has there been any studies on this?*'

Wildlife@rspb.org.uk came back with a really helpful reply - but not good news if you are pet owners...

They wrote: - *Unfortunately the danger of flea treatments does seem to be something that is becoming more evident with new research. People do often try to offer dog/cat fur in gardens to birds in the spring to use in their nests. For quite a few years we have advised against this due to the risks of chemicals impacting the chicks.*

*It wasn't the RSPB who carried out the recent study on flea treatments that appeared in the media, instead the study was carried out by scientists from the University of Sussex and the recent press release stated:*

*"The researchers collected 103 blue and great tit nests that were lined with fur, finding that 100% of the nests contained fipronil, which is banned in the UK and EU for agricultural use, and 89% contained imidacloprid, which was banned in the EU as a plant protection product in 2018. Both are still widely used in pet flea treatments. "*

An [open letter to the Government](#) was signed by several wildlife/environmental organisations back in November 2023 about it. As a pet owner that has been persuaded by vets to subscribe to these spot on treatments, I am very disappointed that nothing seems to have been done about it.

If anyone knows any different, please let me know (or indeed, if anyone has any natural remedies for parasite prevention, again, please share).

## **Uncontacted Indigenous Peoples Report**

Survival International have shared this [Uncontacted Indigenous Peoples Report](#).

They have calculated that there are at least 196 of these groups of people around the world, who are aware of the outside world, but choose not to belong to it. *'They are self-sufficient and resilient. They live independently in forests, sometimes on islands. They resist intrusion, and thrive when their rights are respected.'*

Survival International concludes that all *'uncontacted peoples face threats to their existence.'* The number one threat from those involved in extractive industries, such as mining and logging.

### **"Yanoun is Empty"**

Ann Farr wrote this article, again published through ICN, about the tiny village of Yanoun, from where she and other Human Rights Observers monitored the surrounding area and the Jordan Valley, back

in 2010.

Ann tells the story of what they saw when they were there, and how bad things have been ever since.

She goes on to say: - *The theft of land continued and in recent years has increased drastically and on Boxing Day 2025 we learnt that the grazing land, the harvest and the fertile land in the valley had all been stolen. Animals died due to lack of grazing, and the settlers blocked the only remaining road that gave access to the village and prevented anyone from outside from entering. Villagers, particularly the young people, were harassed continually and anyone from outside, who might have gone to help, feared for their lives if they tried to enter.*

*The families were told recently that they all had to leave and they started to take their animals and belongings out, without anyone being able to come in and help them. On the morning of Sunday 28th December Israeli settlers and military arrived to give them the final ultimatum. They had to have to have left completely by 4pm that day.*

*Just after 4pm, 2pm GMT, we got the message, 'Yanoun is empty'.*

In Ann's words, we just need to 'keep on keeping on so that together with all those Palestinians and Israelis working for justice we can see some hope of peace and justice being a reality.'

#### **4. US plans sanctions against Nigeria to protect Christians in 2026**

Premier Christian News have reported that *the United States has prepared targeted sanctions and further action to protect Christians in Nigeria following military strikes on Christmas Day, according to US lawmakers and advocates.*

*US congressman representative Riley Moore, R-West Virginia, said he will present a report to President Donald Trump that “outlines concrete ways the United States can partner with Nigeria to bring an end to this bloodshed and protect our brothers and sisters in Christ.”*

Nigeria has been a CPC (country of particular concern) for quite some time, and there have been some horrendous atrocities carried out against Christians, including Priests, at the hands of militants/radicals, including ISIS and Boko Haram. The US carried out strikes on ISIS on Christmas Day in co-ordination with the Nigerian authorities.

#### **5. Oppose Israel's Ban on Aid Organisations**

Palestine Solidarity Campaign are asking for our help in writing to Yvette Cooper, Foreign Secretary, to demand the British government provides financial and political support for Palestinian and international organisations and implements immediate sanctions on Israel, including a full two-way arms embargo.

This is on the back of Israel announcing that it will prevent 37 international aid organisations from operating in the Occupied Palestinian Territory, including ActionAid, Medical Aid for Palestinians and Médecins Sans Frontières.

They write: *Right now, Palestinians in Gaza are facing cold weather and heavy rainfall, which is flooding the tents that more than one*

*million displaced Palestinians live in, while Israel continues to block the entry of aid, including blankets, winter clothes and medicines. This latest ban on humanitarian organisations risks entirely collapsing aid delivery in Gaza, further exacerbating the level of suffering.*

The children of the Aida Refugee Camp near Bethlehem are asking for our help in saving their football pitch.

AVAAZ website writes: - *Our football pitch means the world to us. It's where we train, laugh, and feel like kids.*

*This pitch is where we can forget, even for a moment, about the separation wall, watchtowers, the military base, and checkpoints. Hundreds of children and young people come here to train with Aida Youth Center's Aida Football Academy. It's a rare place of safety amid weekly Israeli military incursions, often involving tear gas, rubber bullets, and live ammunition.*

*But now, Israeli authorities want to take it from us, and bulldozers could arrive at any moment to destroy it.*

*We have less than a week – and you can help: If millions of people around the world speak up, football fans, players, and athletes will follow. People like Infantino (FIFA) and Čeferin (UEFA) won't be able to look away anymore. When the football world pays attention, FIFA, UEFA and governments listen.*
