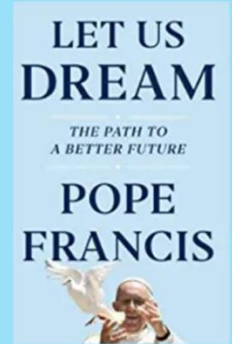

Christian Coalition Calls on Churches to Act

Independent Catholic News writes: 'With only 100 days to go until COP26 - the critical international climate negotiations which the UK government will host and chair in Glasgow in November - a broad coalition of Christian denominations and charities is calling on all churches to hold a 'Climate Sunday' and commit to effective action themselves, before talks begin. So far, more than 1,500 churches across Scotland, England, Wales and Ireland are taking part and hundreds more, including several cathedrals, are planning to do so.' Global leaders must work for the common good after "grim and disturbing" report on climate change

Lead Bishop for the Environment, Bishop John Arnold of Salford, has responded to a new report published by the [Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change \(IPCC\)](#) – a United Nations body for assessing the science related to climate change.

Bishop Arnold stressed that the time has come to act for the common good, not with self-interest or self-serving politics: "*The grim and disturbing findings of the AR6 report only reinforce the message of Pope Francis' Laudato Si – we must do everything we can, and now, to protect and defend Our Common Home.*"

3. Anti-Trafficking/Anti-Slavery

Renate Film Competition - deadline 20th August 2021 (for 16-24 year olds)

ICN writes: - Religious in Europe Networking Against Trafficking and Exploitation (RENATE)

launched its Film Competition and Festival on Anti-Trafficking at BAFTA back in July, on the eve of UN World Day Against Trafficking in Persons. Julian Shaw of BAFTA said it, "was delighted to support Anti-Trafficking work and to host the film festival." The event's moderator was Jon Hackett, Director of Film and Communications at St Mary's, Twickenham.

Sr Imelda Poole IBVM and MBE, head of RENATE and based in Albania, reported that 70% of RENATE's 350+ members work directly with victims of modern-day slavery. "And trafficking covers more than sex trafficking" she said, "it can be labour trafficking and trafficking in human organs."

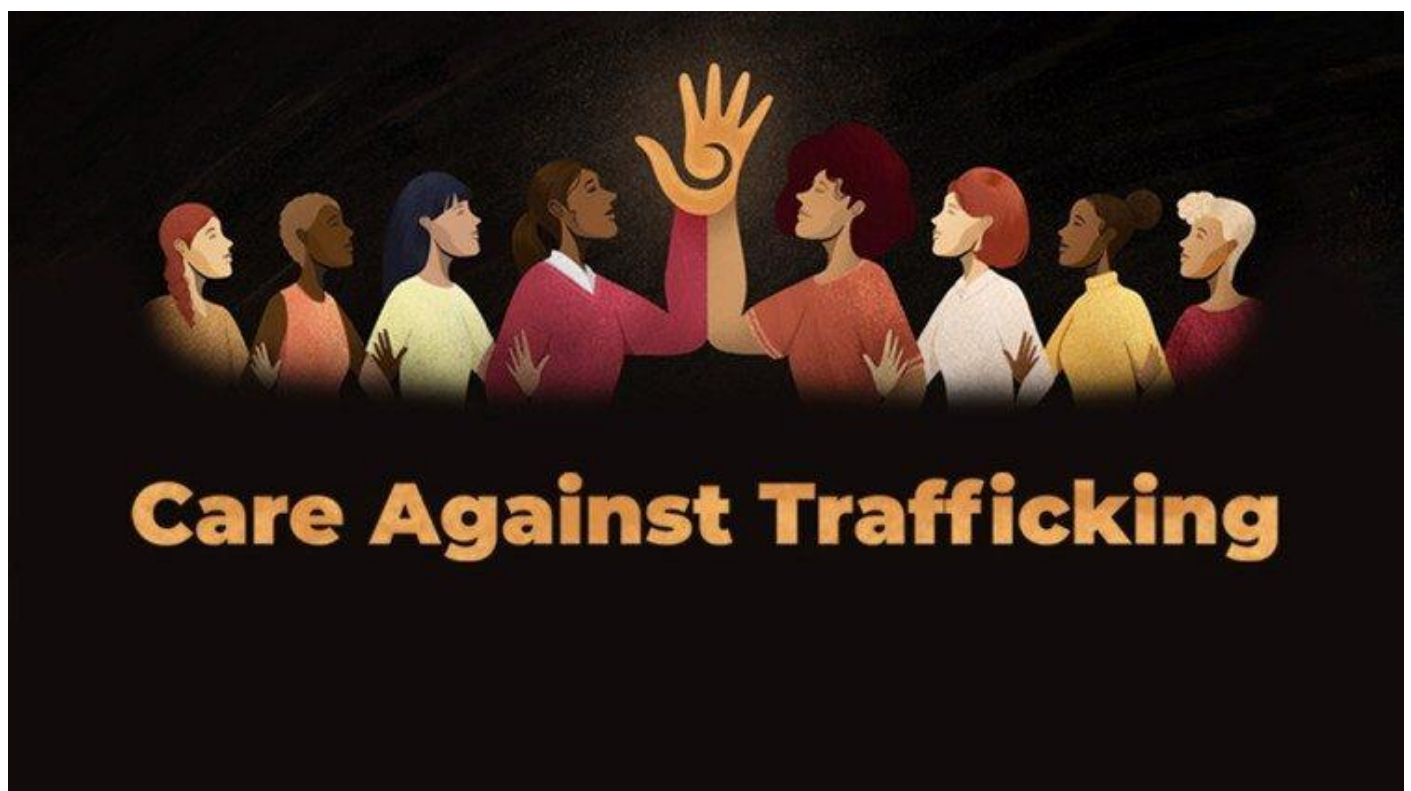

Human Trafficking: why so few convictions?

Fr Shay Cullen writes for Independent Catholic News (quoting figures from the 'Not for Sale Fund') about the fact that there are *"approximately 45.8 million people caught in the trap of modern slavery around the world. This includes 10 million children, 15.4 million people in forced marriage, and 4.8 million people in forced sexual exploitation. However, it is difficult to determine exact statistics because so many cases of human trafficking go undetected and unreported."*

#Care Against Trafficking Campaign



Talitha Kum, the global anti-trafficking network of Consecrated Life Against Trafficking in Persons, launches a new campaign focused on a care-centered model to break the cycle of human trafficking.

4. Refugees/Migrants - (includes an Action)

Life in limbo for people seeking asylum

On the 6th August, JRS UK wrote: - This week the [Independent published a special report](#) looking at the lives of people seeking asylum, who are forced to live in limbo. As they spend years waiting on a decision to be made on their asylum claim, they live in great uncertainty, banned from working, and at risk of exploitation and abuse. These stories echo the harrowing experiences of the friends of JRS who are battling this hostile system, which is founded on suspicion. As they desperately seek to be recognised as refugees, they struggle to survive.

Data shows over 1,200 people seeking asylum currently in the system, have waited more than five years, with 399 more than a decade.

One refugee friend who is supported by JRS sums up the experience:

“We are forgotten people by the system, the system doesn’t care for us, doesn’t look after us.”

“I was abandoned by the system, I was neglected and I didn’t know how to move forward. So, when I came [to JRS] I found each volunteer trying to put their best effort to welcome me with my name, which in itself is a source of comfort.”

“They’re making us feel like a family. It is peaceful and it calms my mind. JRS welcomes each person

Also, as the refugees struggle with destitution, often the greatest concern JRS hear from their friends is where they will sleep tomorrow. With no support available, and a ban on working and earning a living, they are faced to accept precarious accommodation and are always one step away from street homelessness. JRS are in urgent need of volunteer hosts in the London area, who are able to provide temporary accommodation to a refugee friend of theirs.

Tragic death in English Channel

And yet again, another person has died after being rescued from a small boat that was sinking in the Channel whilst trying to reach the UK. JRS said it *“is an indictment of our failure to provide safe means of sanctuary to those fleeing for their lives.”*

“We pray for all who loved him and who will grieve for him.”

Safe routes for child refugees - includes an Action

The Nationality and Borders Bill that the Government published back in July, not only includes no new routes to safety, but it cruelly criminalises refugees and makes it harder for families to be together. Safe Passage writes: - *The Bill rips up the principles of the Refugee Convention, with plans to hold refugees in detention-style camps and cut back on their financial assistance. And it cruelly denies families the right to reunite based on how they entered the UK.*

5. Charles Kasper Burchell RIP

Charlie Burchell died on the 25th July, aged 92, and will be remembered for the justice and peace work he was involved in, both in the Diocese of Shrewsbury and nationally. NJPN Chair, Paul Southgate, described him as a remarkable man.

6. Conflict

Afghanistan: the enduring war

Professor Ian Linden, through ICN, talks about the current Taliban offensive and how unexpected it was, given that the last few troops and contractors were moved out only a few weeks ago. Was it worth it? Professor Linden discusses why the time spent by the Allied forces over there had its plus points, in the fact that over 20 years, some 14 million Afghan women and girls had the doors of education opened to them, and were able to participate more fully in public life. Don't forget Cameroon

Father Anthony Chantry, Director of Missio, has been talking to the Catholic Bishops Conference about the Anglophone Crisis in Cameroon – particularly the Catholic Church's role in working for justice and peace. It's a long-running conflict, with its roots in colonial times, that is often overlooked by the rest of the world. There's no real end in sight and the human cost is severe. Almost one million people have been internally displaced, there are frequent reports of atrocities such as kidnappings and use of torture and more than 3,000 have been killed.

7. Global food insecurity and justice

At the end of July, a Food Systems Pre-Summit took place in Rome, highlighting the need to act together to find sustainable solutions to combat global food insecurity and justice. [Vatican News](#) reports on the Pre-Summit, and what a Food System is.

8. Hidden Arms Sales

Since the Saudi-led bombing of Yemen began in March 2015, the UK government has recorded

£6.8bn

in arms sales to Saudi Arabia

The actual amount exported to the regime in that time is closer to

£20.6bn

Campaign Against Arms Trade's research shows that far from having the most 'rigorous and robust' arms export controls in the world, as Ministers consistently claim, the majority of UK arms exports are supplied via secretive Open Licences, which contain no specific detail on the value of equipment being licensed.

38. Report the UK Government to the UN

The Christian Campaign for Nuclear Disarmament is supporting a campaign to report the UK government to the United Nations for breaking international law by announcing a great increase in its nuclear capability.

Most Christians and many others view reliance on nuclear weapons as immoral, wasteful and hazardous.

IMMORAL: Christian denominations plus leaders of other faiths have condemned dependence on nuclear weapons. Pope Francis has declared that their very possession is wrong.

WASTEFUL: The huge amount of money spent on them should be used for alleviating deprivation. Improvement of health, both at home and abroad, could be much enhanced.

HAZARDOUS: Detonations, whether by design or through accident, are always possible. The UK makes itself a target and gives poor example to others.

This month CCND campaign is submitting its report to the UN along with as many signatures as can be collected.

39. Stop the Liverpool Arms Fair

From 11-13th October 2021, international arms companies are due to meet up with delegations from a range of repressive states at the AOC Europe 2021, at the Exhibition Centre Liverpool.

The event is an exact replica of the Electronic Warfare Europe, which was cancelled last year after pressure from a large coalition of Liverpool civil society groups. In response to their pressure, the then Mayor of Liverpool, Joe Anderson committed to develop “an ethical charter for LCC and the ACC” in order to “set restrictions on what events we can and should have.”

It is therefore deeply concerning to see an arms fair attempt to return to the city, in a venue owned by Liverpool City Council. Arms merchants, including Elbit Systems and Leonardo, whose weapons are used by repressive states are due to attend the fair.

I found someone online who uses organic cotton to make various items - masks, small bags, bunting, lavender bags - pretty much anything that she can sew together, and I asked her if she sold hankies. She didn't, but was happy to give them a go, and I have to say that I was very pleased with the result. I bought a bundle for us - and in fact, at my other half's request, some of his had a pouch sewn onto the back, so that when the tissue was used, he could fold it into it's own pouch, rather than pop a dirty tissue straight into his trouser pocket. If anyone is interested in this lady's online shop, I would be happy to provide them with details.
