To my mother, The Queen, thank you.

As mentioned around the time of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, whether you are a supporter of the Monarchy or not, the fact that she reigned for over 70 years, and was still working two days before her death, at the age of 96, is still something to marvel at. Having said that, as our Cleaner at work said - 'it is much easier to keep going if you have no financial worries, and you have someone else to pick

up after you and your family.'

This is a mass participation and engagement initiative on Climate Change, based on a virtual journey from COP26 in Glasgow to COP27 in Sharm El Sheikh Egypt, starting on 22/09/2022 and finishing on 8/11/2022.

The virtual journey consists of each city/country hosting a virtual or hybrid Town Hall presenting local climate challenges and solutions.

These hybrids will be moderated by Walk2COP27 and local organisers.

Updates, events, distances travelled will be marketed to participants and more generally. Each location can choose to be independent.

Some background - COP 27 is an important global summit on climate change, this summit is known as Conference of the Parties, the 27th annual summit held by the parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change(UNFCCC), commonly known as "COP27"

This year it will be held in Sharm El Sheikh, Egypt from 8th November to the 16th November and seeks to turn climate change pledges into concrete and collaborative actions that effectively responds to global challenges through sustainable solutions that includes participation of the people.

COP15 Conference on Biodiversity in Canada

This will take place in Canada in December, and it is hoped that it will do the same for nature as the Paris Agreement did for the climate in 2015, in the fact that we need to have a Global Biodiversity Framework (GBF), which will start to reverse the loss of biodiversity before 2030, with the overall aim of the world living in harmony with nature by 2050.

Energy/Fracking

Interesting that the Government has now overturned the fracking ban, as expected, and yet this article from The Mail going back to March of this year by Kwasi Kwarteng, as Secretary of State for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy) states exactly the opposite. There is also similar sentiments expressed in this article by The Guardian of around the same time (and I feel much more comfortable sharing the latter!). Shared previously, but too important not to add your name to - Friends of the Earth petition against fracking.

Another petition you may want to add your name to is the <u>Greenpeace</u> one protesting the 'misplaced measures' that Liz Truss and her Government have put in place. Acting as heroes in keeping the energy cap lower than expected...but actually just keeping the Shareholders of the energy companies happy, whilst the rest of us pay for it over a period of time.

Patagonia's billionaire owner gives away company to fight climate crisis

Yvon Chouinard has announced that all of clothing brand Patagonia's profits will go into saving the planet. The company announced on Wednesday that "As of now, Earth is our only shareholder. ALL profits, in perpetuity, will go to our mission to 'save our home planet'." Chouinard himself said "Instead of 'going public', you could say we're 'going purpose'."

Secondhand September

Who would have thought something good would have come from Love Island, but according to My Green Pod's Katie Hill, 'Nearly half of viewers (47%) admit that they would consider buying pre-loved over new items since watching Love Island this year.'

Apparently, eBay UK dressed the participants for the first time ever over the eight weeks that the show ran. 'Seven in 10 viewers (71%) felt they have a more positive perception of secondhand clothing after seeing pre-loved fashion on their screens this summer.'

'Demonstrating the influence of the show, since it ended, eBay UK has seen over 7,000% increase in searches for pre-loved clothing on its site compared with the same period last year.' (although my take on that would be that people cannot afford new clothes compared with the same time last year).



2. Refugees and Migrants



The Catholic Bishops Conference of England and Wales write: - Bishop Paul McAleenan, our Lead Bishop for Migrants and Refugees, says that this year's special day of prayer for migrants and refugees is an opportunity for Catholics throughout the world to remember and pray for those who are displaced through war, poverty and persecution It is also, he points out, a day to raise awareness of the fact that migration offers opportunities for many people.

Supporting refugees fleeing Ukraine

Cate, who is a senior lawyer at Safe Passage and Legal Coordinator of the Ukraine Project, has written the following: - *Many refugees are still struggling to access safe routes six months after the invasion.*

We are now in our second week of operating in Warsaw. and it's already clear that too many refugees have been let down and ignored.

Non-Ukrainian nationals, members of the Roma and traveller communities, and unaccompanied children are all struggling to access a safe route to the UK. Even Ukrainian nationals are finding it difficult to obtain the correct paperwork or lack the support they need to send an application.

Take a couple of examples of what we've seen so far:

An unaccompanied teenager whose parents are still in Ukraine came to see us. She's been trying to reach a family friend in the UK but so far has been unsuccessful as she has struggled with the documents required.

While we value the effort to safeguard children who are travelling alone, safe routes need to be made more accessible for refugees that need them. We are contacting the Home Office and looking to make sure we help with any changes they need to make sure it is successful.

Then there's the Ukrainian humanitarian worker who had no idea that the schemes even existed. She only came in because she was walking past and saw our sign. Now she and her two daughters are looking to submit an application with our help to make certain it succeeds.

Action - Do something worthwhile with your weekend

Calais Light run regular weekend convoys out from near Brentwood in Essex to Calais, France, to help the refugees over there.

They support three charities through manpower and money, not physical donations: - Care4Calais, Calais Appeal and Refugee Community Kitchen.

5. Liz Truss' appalling record on UK arms exports cause for alarm

Independent Catholic News writes: - On 6 September, Liz Truss took office as the UK's new Prime Minister, following Boris Johnson's resignation. Campaign Against Arms Trade, along with numerous activists, handed in an open letter to Downing Street, signed by 7385 people, calling on the new Prime Minister to stop arming the Saudi-led coalition.
